- Spelling Practice: Regular practice of their spellings.

In addition to these core activities, each year group will continue to be provided with a homework menu linked to this term's topic. This optional homework will be celebrated on our social media platforms and praised in class, although no formal feedback will be given by class teachers.

For our **Year 6 pupils**, expectations will be slightly different as we prepare them for the next phase of their education. Year 6 pupils will be expected to:

- Read Daily: Continuing to develop their reading skills.
- Complete Times Table Rockstars Daily: To reinforce their multiplication knowledge.

- **Practice Spellings Daily:** To enhance their spelling abilities.
- **Complete Set Pages in CPG Books:** Focusing on SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation, and Grammar), arithmetic, and reading.

We believe these adjustments will help our pupils focus on essential skills while still providing opportunities for creativity and exploration through optional homework.

Uniform reminders:

As we begin a new term, it is important to re-share our expectations around uniform in line with our school's uniform policy.

Jewellery/Make Up:
