Parent Coach Programme Learning Journey Weeks 1-5

Sadly, the first cohort of our parent coach programme has come to an end after 5 transformational weeks. The feedback from the course has been overwhelming. Thank you to all the parents that took part, your willingness to share, be vulnerable and talk openly about the challenges of parenthood allowed for real personal growth and fresh perspective on how best to support their child.

For those of you who were unable to attend this weeks parent coaching meeting, here are some quick pointers based on the topics discussed this week. week.

- Shouting to punish is counter intuitive and risks damaging your relationship. Whilst not shouting at all, can seem unrealistic.Set yourself the goal of shouting less to start with.
- Take an emotional pause when responding to behaviours that challenge. Work out what exactly pushes your buttons and why.
- Pause, Step back, relational response.
- Adult behaviour matters: children see, children do.

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Positive noticing:

- By implementing positive noticing, you get more of the behaviour that you notice most
- If a child is labeled as something enough, wether it be positive or negative, they will filter their perception of who they are, and who they will become through those labels.
- Positive noticing builds emotional currency that translates to trust and respect.
- Your child's healthy internal voice depends on you positively noticing them
- Think about what you would have liked to be noticed for when you were a child, and the impact that would have had of your self esteem both then and now as an adult.
- If you could imagine a Paddington Bear-sized label hanging off your child's school bag as they walk out of the door - what would you want it to say?
- If you struggle, aim for 8 out of 10 and forgive yourself when you fall off the Gently notice and positively comment on three things to your child every day this week. Start before breakfast to give yourself a good chance!

Consequences:

- A consequence doesn't have to be a punishment.
- . Consequences need to be delivered as soon after the incident as possible. This is critical for younger children, otherwise they forget why they have a consequence.
- Small consequences can be highly effective. There is no evidence that the bigger the consequence the better behaviour gets.
- Shame is not an acceptable punishment.

- Consequences need to be natural consequences. They can be a conversation, small inconveniences, payback tasks - the key is proportionate and rational. For example helping to clear up the mess they made with you.
- Create a list of small, rational, proportionate consequences you can share with your child. Check the list for any traces of shaming. Think about how you will share this plan with your child.

Repairing:

Restorative conversations work when everyone is calm

· Restorative conversations should never be across a desk or eye-to-eye.

· For older children you might want to think about repairing in a different way.For example

note under the door or a text message may be more suitable Here are some key restorative questions. Think about when they can be useful and what they teach us.

What happened?

· What were you thinking at the time?

• What have you thought since?

How did this make people feel?

Who has been affected?

· How have they been affected? · What should we do to put things right?

How can we do things differently in the future?

· Why do you think things went wrong?

· What would make it easier for us to work

· If it happens again what will you change?

· Have restorative conversations for things that need to be restored, not in response to every

incident Have at least one restorative conversation with your child this week and notice their response

Rules:

More rules do not mean better behaviour; guite the reverse. The rules need to fall from the mouths of the adults every time . Children need to learn the rules and then how to apply them in different contexts.

Talk to your child about the rules.

Think about some of the emotions you experience when behaviour is wobbly and how they fuel your adult behaviour. Children need boundaries to feel safe and to know what is expected from them.

Carefully explain how the rules apply each time you meet a new situation that demands some control over behaviour. Implement three rules using three words, eg: kind, respectful, safe.

' By tuning into my own behaviour, I feel I am better able to communicate with my child which makes daily task like getting ready for school more manageable. We have seen a decrease in shouting at home by at least 50% '- Parent of Biscovey.
