



Uniform Expectations



We are very proud of how smart the children look in our school uniform and can see a noticeable difference in their approach to school life when they are well presented. As a school we will continue to have very high standards for uniform.

As a reminder our school uniform is as follows:

- Black or grey trousers
- Black or grey skirt (knee length or below),

- Blue and white checked summer dress (late spring/summer term only)
- Black, navy or grey socks/ tights.

Raising a concern



It is very important to us that you have any concerns dealt with swiftly and promptly. I wanted to share the process with you all again for raising concerns to ensure that any queries, questions or concerns are raised with the appropriate person.

- Any concerns should be raised directly with the class teacher in the first instance and opportunity give for the matter to be investigated and findings fed back to you.
- 2. If you feel the matter is continuing or that you are unhappy with how it has been dealt with then you need to raise you concerns with the year groups phase leader (Mr Salway Y3 and 4. Miss Munson Y5 and Y6). If the issue is a matter regarding either Mr Salway or Miss Munson then it needs to be raised with either Miss Bignell or Mr Wallbank.
- 3. If the mater continues following your meeting with the phase leader then a meeting or conversation is to be had with Mr Wallbank or Miss Bignell.
- 4. If following Mr Wallbank and Miss Bignell's investigation/ handling of the matter you are still unhappy, then a meeting will then take place with Mr Tyers.
