Further develop our writing curriculum to enable children's grammatical understanding to go grow over time.

Jewellery/Make Up:

Jewellery should not be worn in school, with the exception of one studded earing per ear. Make up/nail varnish should also not be worn.

<u>Hair:</u>

Hairstyles should be reasonable and appropriate for being in a learning environment. Extreme hairstyles which are not permitted would include shaved patterns in the scalp, Mohicans and unnaturally coloured dyes.

Watches:

Watches are allowed, though 'smart' watches with the ability to message/photograph/etc. should not be worn. Watches will need to be removed for P.E. lessons. (The above is all taken from the agreed uniform policy).

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Relationship Policy at Biscovey

At Biscovey, we know that developing and sustaining positive relationships is central to the success of our schools. We believe that trusting, honest, and caring relationships must exist between all members of the school community and, most importantly, between adults and children. Relationships must be authentic. Everyone at Biscovey understands that they have a responsibility to support the growth of positive relationships, that constant maintenance is required to maintain them, and that there will be times when relationships rupture, but that we all have a duty to help repair these.

Biscovey's relationship policy provides the foundations for the behaviour policy. Adults all know that behaviour is understood as communication and that poor behaviour is a result of an unmet need. All staff have been trained in ways to be in relationship with children, and each other, that helps everyone work together in a positive and productive way to support the emotional needs of our children and nurture positive behaviour.

Our approach to relationships is based on the teachings of Trauma Informed Schools UK (TISUK). It is underpinned by educational practises which 'Protect, Relate, Regulate and Reflect'.



Behaviour Support Policy

In class, we have systems for reinforcing positive behaviours, such as 'Our Behaviour Horizon'. Within each class, a similar scale will be displayed, and all pupils will start on green at the beginning of each lesson. Dependent upon behaviours, they will move left or right. It is crucial that this is displayed in a horizontal manner to avoid the negative connotations associated with moving 'down'.




Parent Survey Results
