The curriculum states that all children should be able to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25m. They should be able to use a range of strokes and have knowledge of safe, self-rescue in different water-based situations.

Overview

Curriculum P.E.:

- All classes received two hour of timetabled P.E. per week throughout the year.
- All children received one week of intensive swimming lessons provided by swimming teachers at Polkyth Leisure Centre.
- All classes are provided with three lessons of either archery or fencing n the summer term.

Extra-Curricular Provision:

- Each term a range of sporting clubs are provided to all pupils.
- These are provided by school staff, both teachers and teaching assistants.
- Clubs are charged at a price of £5 for a term, with PP children able to attend for free.

Inter-School Competition:

- The school took part in many different sporting competitions, including friendly fixtures, local and county level competitions.
- In 23-24, 110 pupils represented the school in competitive sport (42.3%).
- In 23-24, We had success with our Girls' football team reaching the county finals.
- In 23-24, Our Year 3 cricket team also reached the county finals.
- In 23-24, Our netball A and B Teams were both champions of their local league.
- In 23-24, all four cross country teams finished in top three positions in their leagues, with the Year 5 Girls' being league champions.

Additional Opportunities:

- In 24-25, we arranged visits to watch Exeter Chiefs rugby and Bristol City v Manchester United Women's football.
- In 23-24, our Year 4 residential, which every child attended, included a day of activities involving archery, zorbing and polo.
- In 23-24, our Year 5 residential included a tour of Old Trafford, home of Manchester United.
- In 23-24, Our Year 5 classes enjoyed a day of paddleboarding at Polkerris Beach.
